## **ClassCharts Launch and Updates**

Since September we have been using a new data system called ClassCharts as a way to monitor and manage behaviour and attendance at Smestow Academy. This has allowed the school to monitor the number of behaviour points each pupil has received. I'm pleased to say that the vast majority of these points have been for positive reasons. Since September staff have recognised and rewarded over 34,500 positive behaviour points!

We are now going live to parents with this system to use it as a tool to communicate the positive events in school and negative events such as detentions and poor punctuality.

You will soon be receiving an email (to the email account you have provided school) before Friday 16 February inviting you to download the ClassCharts Parent app. The email will also provide you with your unique code and instructions of how to log into your parental account so that you can monitor how we are recording the behaviour and attendance of your child or children during each school day. Please check your junk email box for this also. If you do not receive this code, please contact your child's House Office.

We have found ClassCharts to be an excellent way of identifying those pupils who really are putting in the extra effort in their studies. It also supports us to identify those pupils who need to pay more attention to their behaviour and punctuality in school for us to intervene.

## **MMR Vaccination Clinics in Wolverhampton**

Message from Wolverhampton Local Authority – please do not contact the school regarding this, as it is a message from the Local Authority that we have been asked to share.

Increase in measles cases across the West Midlands and MMR catch up clinics. In response to the increasing number of measles cases across the Black Country, MMR vaccination clinics are available during half term for school aged children and adults who have missed a dose. The clinics will be staffed by healthcare professionals from the NHS and Vaccination UK who specialise in childhood vaccinations and follow all necessary safety protocols. Children will need to be accompanied by a





parent or guardian at the clinics. Where possible, please pre-book an appointment slot by calling 01902 200077 but walk-ins will also be accepted. Porcine free vaccinations are available on request (please book ahead).
